Preface



On 24th of December, 2011 Election Commission of India has declared the programme for general election for the Uttar Pradesh State Legislative Assembly to be conducted in seven phases in the state. Accordingly, district Mau will be covered in the second phase of election process and the voters here will exercise their franchise on 11th of February, 2012 between 7.00 am to 5.00 pm. About 14.12 lac voters will cast their votes on the day while 54738 voters among them will get this opportunity for the first time.

Every adult citizen whose name is registered in the electoral roll has the right to exercise his franchise. In order to ensure that they may use their voting right freely and without any fear all concerned officers deployed in the election process are directed to perform their duties with honesty, integrity and absolute neutrality. The concerned authorities are also directed to ensure the compliance of Model Code of Conduct (MCC) and to have a strict vigil over the expenditures of candidates and other orders and directions of Election Commission of India (ECI) strictly, so that a free and fair poll may be conducted.

Every necessary step is being taken by the District Election Office for these elections. There are Total 870 polling centers and 1441 polling stations in the district. Nearly 6000 polling personnel will perform their duties in these polling stations. Besides the state police force, adequate number of Central Para Military Forces (CPMF) will also be deployed for securing these polling stations.

This District Election Management Plan in your hand contains detailed information and instructions regarding each and every aspect of the polling process. I believe that this management plan will not only be helpful for each and every official who is connected with election process but also it will provide useful guidelines for them to perform their duties and responsibilities in a better way.

1- General Information-

There are 04 Assembly constituencies in the district namely 353-Madhuban, 354-Ghosi, 355-Mohamadabad Gohna (SC) and 356-Mau. Assembly Constituency 353-Madhuban came into existence for the first time in this election after delimitation. 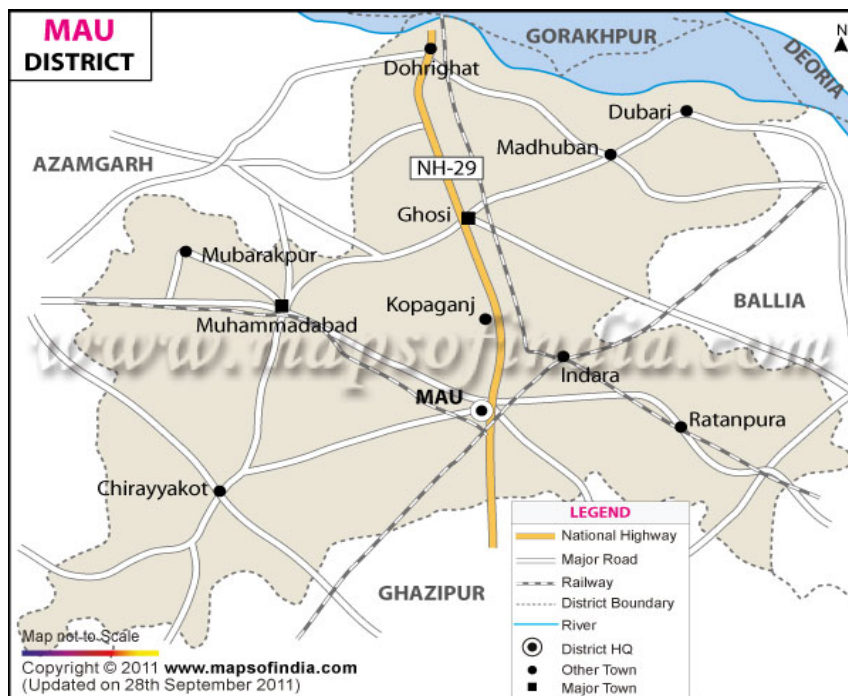

3- Geography-

A part of Azamgrah Commissionery, District Mau took its shape as a District in 1988 comprising of certain areas of Azamgarh and Ballia. Located between 83.17 degree to 84.32 degree eastern longitude and 24.47 degree to 26.17 degree northern latitude with river *Ghaghra* as its lifeline which separates this district from Gorakhpur and Deoria; Mau is surrounded by Gorakhpur, Deoria, Ballia, Gazipur and Azamgrah districts.



District headquarter is at the city of Maunath Bhanjan which is on Gorakhpur-Varanasi National highway No-29. There are 04 *Tehsils* (sub-divisions), 09 Blocks, 11 police stations and 24 police *chowkis* in Mau district. Mau comprises of 1499 populated villages, 92 *Nyaya panchayats*, 596 *gram panchayats*, 07 urban towns and 02 census towns.

4- Demography-

According to the census of 2011 the population of district is approximately 22.05 lac of which 11.14 lac is male population and 10.9 lac are female. The decadal percentage growth (2001-2011) of district is 18.88% with the population density of 1287 while the sex ratio is 978 over 1000 male population. Child population (0-6 years) of the district is 327500 and the sex ratio in children is 924 over 1000 male child. Literacy rate of the district is 75.16% consisting of 84.61% male literacy and 65.59% of female literacy. District's population shares 1.10% population of the State's population in 2011. District Mau ranks 44th position in State regarding population holding the same position w.r.t. the census of 2001. While if we see the grading of district in sex ratio, in census of 2011, Mau holds the 6th rank in district which was 5th in the last census.

According to the electoral list published on 2nd of January, 2012, total number of voters in the district is 1412904, among which 775311 are male voters and 637474 are female voters.

5- Literacy details of the District –

The overall gender ratio of the district is 978:1000. The literacy rate of the district is 75.16% out of which male literacy rate is 84.61% while the female literacy percentage is 65.55% only. This literacy rate in the last population was 62.15%. According to the estimated figures of Census of 2011, total number of literate persons in district is approximately 14.11 lac comprising of 7.99 lac male and 6.11 lac female population.

As per the Census of 2011 Mau's ranking in overall literacy in State is 12th while in male population literacy criteria district stands on 17th rank and w.r.t. female population Mau ranks 11th position in State. It is also noteworthy that the State's average of literacy rate is 69.72.

At district level the work of District Election Officer (DEO) is performed by District Magistrate. To assist him ADM (F/R) is deputed as Deputy DEO. Besides, there is a full time post of Assistant DEO. All the workings related to election are executed by District Election Office situated at the ground floor of the Collectorate building.

A 24X7 highly equipped control room, with 02 telephone lines, is established in Room No-34 of Collectorate. With the help of special software with voice logger and computers, all the complaints regarding election is being audio recorded and digital record is also being made. Mr. Ram Prasad, Deputy Collector, is officer incharge of this control room. The telephone numbers of the control room are 0547-2225026 and 0547-2225027.

11- General Law & Order, History of District – Constituency specific- to the extent possible

District Mau has a mixed population of Hindus and Muslims. Unfortunately, the City of Maunath Bhanjan has a history of communal disturbances and therefore, the District is considered as highly sensitive from the law and order point of view. However, no communal incident of notable significance has taken place after 2005.

10- Booths selected for Webcasting-

ECI has decided to cover 100 polling stations in the district through webcasting. Mr. Pankaj Singh Rana, ALC, Mau has been appointed as the Nodal Officer for Webcasting and SMS service. As per the directions of ECI a committee is also formed under the Chairmanship of Mr. P. P. Singh, Dy. DEO/ADM (F/R) with DIO, NIC, TDM, BSNL, JTO Broad Band, Mau as its members to look into the matter.

D- LOGISTIC PLAN

Mr. Kailash Prakash, CDO has been appointed as In-charge officer for polling personnel. The information of polling personnel is being collected from all the centre/state departments and establishments. NIC is using the EPDS package of Election Commission of India for maintaining the database of polling personnel. As per the directions of the Commission, 120 percent data of the actual requirement (Actual requirement+20% reserve) has undergone for the first randomization on 14.01.2012 and appointment letters for Presiding officer and Polling officer-I have been issued. Remaining randomization stages will take place as per the directions of the Commission and Observers.

A- Polling personnel

As per the directions of ECI, to conduct poll in 1441 polling stations, around 8600 polling personnel are required to be appointed as members of polling parties (each polling party consisting of presiding officer, polling officer1, polling officer 2, and polling officer3). As per the directions of the ECI, Micro Observers will be stationed in selected polling stations in around 25% of the polling stations. For this database of around 400 officials, who are central government employees is prepared. The requirement for polling personals to be deployed on polling booths will be as follows-

C- EVM training-

Practical exposure and training of Presiding officers and polling officer-I will be done twice in two phases. This training will be conducted in Sonidhapa Inter College, Sahadatpura. After brief instructions, these personnel will be divided in small groups of 40 and they will be familiarized with EVMs. At the end of training a short test regarding polling and EVM will also be conducted. Absentee personnel would be taken up in the last session.

D- Micro Observers-

As per the instructions of Election Commission of India, Micro observers will be deployed in 25% booths out of total 1441 polling booths in the District. These Micro observers will be deployed in critical, hyper sensitive and sensitive booths with the consent of the Observers. These micro-observers will work directly under the supervision of Observers of the Election Commission and while performing their duties they will report to the observers to ensure free and fair poll. Mr. R. B. Pal, PD, DRDA has been appointed as the Nodal Officer for Micro Observers. The election office has a data base of 374 personnel ready to be utilized as Micro-observers. There will be a separate cell for these micro-observers on the day of departure of polling parties and on 11th of February while depositing the EVM's.

E- Sector/ Zonal magistrate -

In order to conduct free and fair poll the district has been divided in 10 zones and 87 sectors. Total 97 officers have been appointed as Magistrates in these sectors. In a training programme held for these magistrates on 12.01.2012, they have been briefed about their duties. A list of zonal and sector magistrates and their duties/responsibilities is annexed herewith as annexure no- 2. Besides this, class-1 key officials will work as Super Zonal Magistrate on poll day in their respective territory allotted to them.

E- MOVEMENT PLAN

1- Sector Movement Plan-

The district has been divided into 87 sectors regarding polling. A detailed route chart for convenient movement of polling parties, police personnel and security forces has been prepared ensuring the shortest and best route to move quickly in the sector (which is annexed as a separate booklet named as 'route chart'). Rehearsals are being done on each of these identified routes mentioned in the route chart and all the hindrances are being removed.

2- Vehicle Management Plan-

Mr. Sheetla Prasad Srivastava, City Magistrate, Nodal officer for vehicles,, with the help of Mr. Shyamlal, ARTO and Mr, Subhas Chandra, DSO, has assessed and arranged the requirement for vehicles (buses, LMVs and heavy vehicles) for movement of polling parties, security forces and sector/zonal magistrates and other authorities deployed on polling and counting duties. Requisition orders have been served to all necessary offices and proprietors for the purpose. The deficiency in respective categories will be managed through divisional pool. Besides this, UPSRTC buses will serve the purpose for transportation of CPMF as per standards and requirement. The table below shows a glance of required and available vehicles in the district.

The deficiency in respective categories will be managed through Divisional Pool. Besides this, UPSRTC buses will serve the purpose for transportation of CPMF as per standards and requirement.

3- Police Deployment Plan:

In order to conduct free and fair poll, Police force will be deployed in such a way that during elections/polling, maximum area is covered reducing the possibility of any mishap and establishing a fear-free environment. Deployment of CPMF and State police will be finalized in consultations with and with the consent of Observers, taking in to account the vulnerability and sensitivity of booths. The police department will formulate and submit its management plan separately. Besides the elections, general law and order situation will be the top priority and is being closely monitored taking all the necessary steps. A seprate booklet regarding the Police Management Plan is enclosed with this plan.

4- Communication Plan:

A detailed Communication plan for the Elections has been prepared (Annexed as a separate booklet). Communication plan has also been uploaded on Commission's website. All the contact numbers have been checked. Instructions have been issued to all the operators will make necessary arrangements during polls, especially on the poll day and in shadow areas, to avoid jamming/congestion in the network. Police administration will ensure ample availability of wireless

handsets with magistrates and police authorities. Besides this a high-tech 24X7 control room (tel no. 0547-2225026 and 0547-2225027) will remain working till election process ends.

F- COUNTING MANAGEMENT PLAN

For the storage of used EVMs and polling materials after they are duly received, the following rooms of the collectorate building will be used as strong room. All necessary arrangements will be made for the safe storage and the whole place will be handed over to security forces/CPMF.

G- WELFARE MANAGEMENT FOR POLLING PERSONNEL

Mr. Ram Sharan Singh, DIOS, has been appointed as nodal officer for welfare of polling personnel to address the issues related with human resources. To add more to it, AC wise four officers with their team have also been deputed for the welfare of polling personels.

- 1- **Welfare management during training-** In order to provide amenities to polling personals during training sessions necessary and proper arrangements like clean drinking water, shades/shadows, adequate number of chairs and tables, fans, temporary toilets, free of cost safe vehicle stand, arrangement of around 700 chairs with shadow for briefing along with personnel attendance system have been made. Practical/interactive sessions with EVM would be conducted in class rooms of Sonidhapa College, sahadatpura. The election office will post its attendants at training venues to attend the instantaneous requirements arising before and during training sessions.
- 2- **Welfare management during departure of polling parties-** The basic needs and requirements will also be taken care off on the day of departure of polling parties. The nodal officer will see to it that clean drinking water and toilets in adequate number are available. He will also ensure that if the departure process lasts long and polling parties have to wait for a long time for transportation or any thing else, some refreshments are available for them. He will also be responsible for coordinating with police and security officials and personnel.
- 3- **Welfare management on poll day-** On the day of poll i.e. on 11th of February, 2012 it will be ensured that the necessary and basic amenities like clean drinking water, availability of adequate furniture, shadow and toilets to conduct polling smoothly. Authorities have been directed to check the electric points and appliances like bulbs and fans, wherever necessary at polling centers.
- 4- **Welfare management on the day of counting-** Same as the arrangements made for departure, the basic needs and requirements will also be taken care off during the time of depositing EVMs. The nodal officer will see to it that clean drinking water and toilets in adequate number are available and there is proper arrangement for polling personals comfort. The polling personnel will be relieved as soon as they deposit the EVMs and other election related records at the respective counters made for the purpose and after submitting necessary certificates in appropriate formats to the authorized officials/magistrates. Besides this arrangements will also be made for easy transportation for these personnel.
- 5- **Welfare management for CPMF-** The Police management system for comfortable stay and movement of CPMF will address all the points regarding CPMF.
- 6- Above all, Dr. M. P. Singh, Chief Medical Officer (CMO), with a team of doctors, ambulances and necessary medical kits, will ensure medical facilities for the personnel engaged in election process.
